Presentations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Arin Peters, Hydrologist with the National Weather Service provided a spring forecast (attached) with a focus on flood potential. Compared to many places in Montana, Gallatin County looks pretty good, however we still have several factors lined up to cause flooding issues. The interesting part of the current statistics is the Jefferson River in Three Forks. It shows the highest likelihood of reaching moderate flooding, which is not a normal occurrence.
Action Items	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mike Maltaverne started off a discussion about our community's response to violent attacks and proposed a process to better plan out both our initial response and extended response/ recovery activities. There was good support for better defining this with several of the pieces already in the works. There are two sessions of Active Attack Integrated Response scheduled to July in Bozeman that trains law enforcement and medical personnel to operate using the Rescue Task Force Concept. It also appears that Gallatin County's regional homeland security grant (with Park and Madison) will be funded. We won't know for sure until the state receives their award amount from FEMA. Assuming we do get the project funded, that will provide for MCI caches around the 3 counties, MCI bus, Common MCI system and ballistic PPE for medical personnel. <p>Volunteers were solicited to participate in a small committee to further develop the coordinated process for violent attacks.
