Emergency Management	 Patrick advised that Gallatin County received an increase in the amount of available Emergency Management Performance Grant funding. This additional funding will be used to offset upgrades that 911 will be conducting this year on the backup dispatch at the EOC.
Citizen Corps	•
Unified Health Command	 Patrick handed out copies of the current draft version of the Multiple Patient Incident Plan. People are to review and bring back their comments next month at AHAD. They can also send any feedback to Patrick. Bryan Connelley also explained that the Fire Council is looking at how they can make better use of their management staff resources on large incidents. They are looking at forming some sort of automatic Management Staff assignments into CAD for larger incidents. There was also a discussion on how the resource coordination of ground and air resources can be cleaned up.
Schools	 Bruce advised that the Bozeman School District is setup with parent contacts in the Reverse 911 system. This capability is open to any school in the county.
Training & Exercise	 Patrick talked about NIMS ICS specific training that is being offered by the federal government. A lot of the specifics are not really known about these courses, except that each one is being offered 4 times and all costs are covered. It was asked if the state has a plan for who they are sending to these train the trainer courses. That was unknown. Craig suggested that Patrick contact Bob Fry about this, since he is working on some similar projects at the state.

Volunteers Active in Disaster	 Patrick handed out a draft Donations Management and Spontaneous Volunteers plan for people to look at. People were asked to bring feedback in August. This is an initial draft that the Help Center and United Way have worked on.
Communications	 Frank advised that the tower at the new dispatch center should be in by Friday. The opening date of the new center is now October 12. There will be a paging meeting on July 29th starting at 1800 at the Belgrade Bar 3 BBQ followed by the main meeting at 1900 at the Central Valley Training Center.

	 The Fire North upgrade is coming along. The NEPAs are all now approved. Frank advised that Gallatin County will be keeping Grassy Mountain after all. Bryan asked when the new HipLinx system will be coming online. Bruce advised that it should be in the near future after the procurement procedure is worked out.
Other	 Major Dean Roberts introduced himself as the new commander of the 83rd CST. He advised that they have access to funding to help support local training exercises or courses. The CST also has two days of exclusive access to the Vigilant Guard Exercise rubble pile in Helena. Anyone that is interested in more than welcome to come up and work on collapse rescue during their time slot.
