Training And Exercise Plan





Training Program Overview

Gallatin County provides training to government entities as part of our preparedness activities towards preparing responders for responding to incidents. The County is involved in supplying this training through several different venues (FEMA, SC Zone, in house) which varies the exact audience and criteria. This plan provides an overview of our procedures and frequent courses which are held in the county.

Registration

Registrations will always be required for county training events to ensure appropriate student space, materials, and instructor ratios. The extent of the registration information required will vary, but at a minimum will consist of Name, Agency, and Email. We must have this for each individual, not a single point of contact for an entity. Reminders and changes will be emailed out and it is best to go directly to the students.

Individuals to registers for a training activity are committing that they (the individual registered) will attend, or provide adequate notice of cancellation. Individuals who do not show up after registering are wasting training money and may be depriving someone else of the opportunity. Individuals who are no shows may be charged for the full cost of the training (prorated per student cost to hold the training).

Evaluations

Event evaluations will be conducted for each class to capture what went well and what can be improved. Typically this will be conducted electronically.

Prerequisites

In events where prerequisites are required, it is the students' responsibility to ensure they meet the requirements to attend. Gallatin County will conduct prerequisite checks for 10% of the students. Students who do not meet the required prerequisites will not be allowed to attend. If it is discovered that someone who attended a event did not meet the prerequisite requirements, their certificate will not be issued and their name will be stricken from the completion notice.

Notices

After the registration closes, a Selection Notice will be sent to all accepted students. This will typically be an email and may also include a PDF version. This will identify the selected students, event information, and any other pertinent information.

Approximately 1 week prior to the beginning of the event registered students will receive a reminder notice. This will contain pertinent event information and any other needed information.

Following the end of the event, each participant who successfully completes the event will receive a Completion Notice. This notice will contain the event information and the names of the individuals who completed the event.

Certificates

Certificates will be issued for most events. The type of certificate and issuing entity will vary depending on the event being provided.

Incident Command System

Incident Command System courses are utilized to teach the technical aspects of utilizing ICS. These courses are not design to develop tactical skills, but are an essential supporting skill for tactical skills. ICS 100, 200, 300, and 400 are available through several curriculum providers. All the courses are essentially the same courses, meet the same objectives, and are interchangeable. They may however be presented differently or have different focuses. The primary sources for curriculum are the National Wildfire Coordinating Group, National Fire Academy (US Fire Administration), and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (Department of Homeland Security).

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Exercises

Many agencies have a variety of exercise requirements annually. Gallatin County works to try and combine exercises to meet multiple needs. The following are known exercises that reoccur on a regular basis:

Yellowstone Gateway Airport	The airport is required to hold an annual exercise to be compliant with FAA Requirements. Every three years this must be a Full Scale Exercise with the two years in between being Table Top Exercises.
Hebgen Dam	PPL Montana is required to hold exercises periodically as part of their Emergency Action Plan annual update process. Typically a Table Top Exercise is held annually with a Functional Exercise held periodically.
Madison Dam	PPL Montana is required to hold exercises periodically as part of their Emergency Action Plan annual update process. Typically a Table Top Exercise is held annually with a Functional Exercise held periodically.
Middle Creek Dam	Montana DNRC conducts an annual Emergency Action Plan update. Periodically an exercise will conducted as part of this revision process.
Willow Creek Dam	Montana DNRC conducts an annual Emergency Action Plan update. Periodically an exercise will conducted as part of this revision process.
Green Hollow Dam	Turner Enterprises conducts an annual Emergency Action Plan update. Periodically an exercise will conducted as part of this revision process.
Big Sky Dam	Boyne Resorts conducts an annual Emergency Action Plan update. Periodically an exercise will conducted as part of this revision process.
Health Department	The Gallatin City-County Health Department is typically required to participate in a variety of exercise activities annually due to grant funding requirements.

Coordination Center Gallatin County hosts a minimum of one exercise each year in the Gallatin County Coordination Center. There vary between tabletop, functional, and full scale.

Other Annually a variety of additional exercises will occur in coordination with numerous agencies.
